

Immatures retain all or most juvenile remiges, greater primary coverts and rectrices and varying number of juvenile greater and median coverts;

Retained juvenile feathers are contrastingly more worn and shorter than replacing feathers and synchronous growth bars are usually visible in the tail;

Full adult plumage is first attained in a birds' third year, thus adults are aged (3+);

Immatures can be aged as either (1), (2) or (2-) depending on plumage condition and time of year

## Sexing: NOTE: Birds must be sexed before banding;

At all ages, sex can be determined by measurements, with males much larger than females; Males in breeding condition have a black bill and gape, but change seasonally to adult female-like colours of brown, grey-brown, or dark flesh brown with a paler lower mandible; Female alone incubates.
